	Official documentation of passage of Content Test 246 (or different test for SOS majors finishing the old program)
	Submission of evidence or resume showing that you have joined at least one professional organization (this is a COE requirement). A list of organizations will be distributed in SOS 3400. Strongly recommended: NCSS.
	You need to submit evidence or resume showing your attendance at least two professional conferences, including the Annual
	History and Social Studies Teachers Conference held at EIU every fall. One conference may be replaced with attendance of
	at least three one-hour lectures or online PD. A list of online options is available from the social science teaching coordinator.
	You will submit an e-portfolio containing items such as a resume, cover letter, source analysis, etc., in SOS 3400.
	You will submit three reference sheets from social science faculty while in SOS 3400.
Testing	Requirements:
	You must fulfill the Basic Skills requirement for the state of Illinois. Fulfillment of this must show in your degree audit by the
	semester prior to student teaching. Consult with your advisor, the SOS coordinator, and the TASC center as needed for help.
	Pass the appropriate Content Area Test (for most students, this is ILTS test 246, found at
	https://www.il.nesinc.com/TestView.aspx?f=HTML_FRAG/IL246_TestPage.html) by mid-semester prior to student teaching. It
	is crucial that you take this test early the semester prior to student teaching to ensure time for a report and re-take if needed.
	You will not be approved for student teaching if you do not have an official pass score on file with COE.
	Submit and receive a passing score on edTPA during student teaching.
