

CRIMINOLOGY MINOR

Total Semester hours: 21

The interdisciplinary Criminology minor allows students to select one of two options, **Criminal Justice** or **Criminal Administration**, to better suit their anticipated career interests and to better complement their majors. Double counting coursework in concert with students' majors and other minors is permitted by the minor in criminology. Coursework constituting the criminology minor may include Honors Programs course equivalents; existing prerequisites for courses must be satisfied. (* denotes a prerequisite) Although added to EIU's curriculum in AY2006-07, the Criminology Minor is effective back through the 2000-01 EIU Catalog. Thus, it is not necessary for students declaring this minor to change to a current catalog. Interested students are strongly encouraged to declare this minor early.
