- I. Defining the problem
 - a. Enrollment Management perspective
 - i. Need for students to be able to find pathways by career title (e.g. veterinarian)
 - ii. While we can edit the EIU application, changes to the Common Application are more difficult
 - iii. Would like keywords added to the <u>Majors & Minors page</u> (e.g. "therapist")
 - b. Academic department perspective
 - Some pathways do not align 1-to-1 to a degree plan, and students need to also have a major to ensure timely progression and graduation
 - ii. multiple majors can guide a student to a goal (e.g. medical school)
 - c. Advising perspective
 - Many pre-health pathways do not connect to any degree plan in Degree Works, meaning students cannot track their progress easily
- II. Samples
 - a. Combos provided by Josh
 - Estimated 200+ undergraduates with a pre-health pathway and no Degree Works plan; additional 100 on the pre-nursing pathway
 - b. Student examples (reviewed cases in the meeting)
 - i. Pre-Nursing
 - ii. Exercise Science Pre-PT
 - iii. Pre-Medicine
 - iv. Pre-Vet
- III. Solutions
 - a. Improved pathways in Degree Works
 - i. Danny to email Dr. Farley and then Angie Cawthon and Janet Fopay to explore the feasibility of linking pre-nursing pathway to nursing (tradition) degree plan in Degree Works

ii. Additional ideas to prompt students to select a major with their pre-health pathway would enable Degree Works to display the major requirements as intended

b. The role of the advisor

- i. Academic advisors would help ensure students have paired the best fit major with their pre-health pathway
- ii. Help students select prerequisites needed for their professional program as part of their degree plan for the major

c. Brainstorming

- i. Ensure applications refer to pre-health "pathways" rather that majors. The current application uses "plan of study."
- ii. Use PRM to send customized messages to students who select a pre-health pathway to make it clear that they also must choose a major.
- iii. Make it part of the myEIU checklist that students who select a prehealth pathway would need to choose a major during orientation reservation.
- iv. Modify the orientation reservation so that when students select a pre-health pathway as their plan of study that they get a follow-up question to choose a major.
 - Example 1: Pre-Social Work would lead to major choices of a BSW in Human Services or a BSW in Sociology. It is possible that a BA in Psychology might be listed as an option with a note that it is a pathway to a graduate program in social work.
 - 2. Example 2: Pre-Medicine would offer common degree plans such as Biology and Chemistry but also note that any EIU undergraduate degree is a good choice.
 - 3. Example 3: Pre-Physical Therapy would offer common degree plans such as Biology and Exercise Science but also note that any EIU undergraduate degree is a good choice.
- v. Automate the plan of study selections on the orientation reservation to flow into and update Banner.
