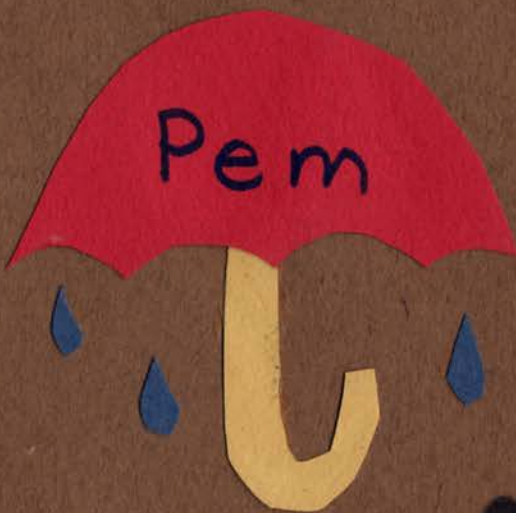





Our New President

Fite wants greatness for ELU

In his first talk to the Eastern faculty, President Gilbert C. Fite spoke of the future of the university and his role as president. He also stressed the need for teacher

dedication and research.

"I declare here and now that true greatness for this university is my goal as president," Fite stated. He went on to outline his plans for Eastern.

President Gilbert C. Fite stressed the need for teacher research and dedication and his desire for future greatness at Eastern in his speech Thursday to the faculty.

"IN THE first place, we will have to obtain more liberal financial support," Fite said. He promised to do everything in his power to increase the resources of Eastern.

The second point in his plan to see Eastern recognized among the best small universities in the United States involves, "building an even more distinguished faculty."

He said that "this can be done through continued self-improvement of current faculty and careful recruiting."

FITE'S third objective is to obtain more resources for the library.

"No university can amount to much without a first rate library collection," Fite said.

The fourth point in Fite's plan for Eastern is to be "ever concerned about developing relevant and meaningful courses and programs for a high quality student body."

FITE SAID that he did not come under the false pretenses of being, "a high-powered budget man" or administrator.

He told people who selected him that what he had to offer was, "long experience in teaching and research." "I happen to think that this is what

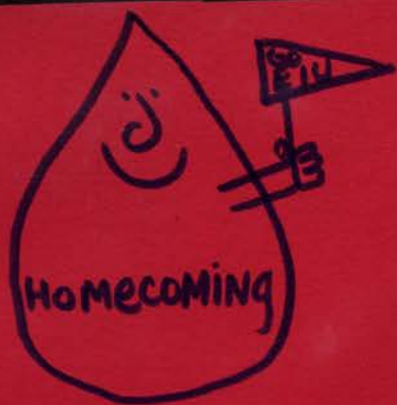

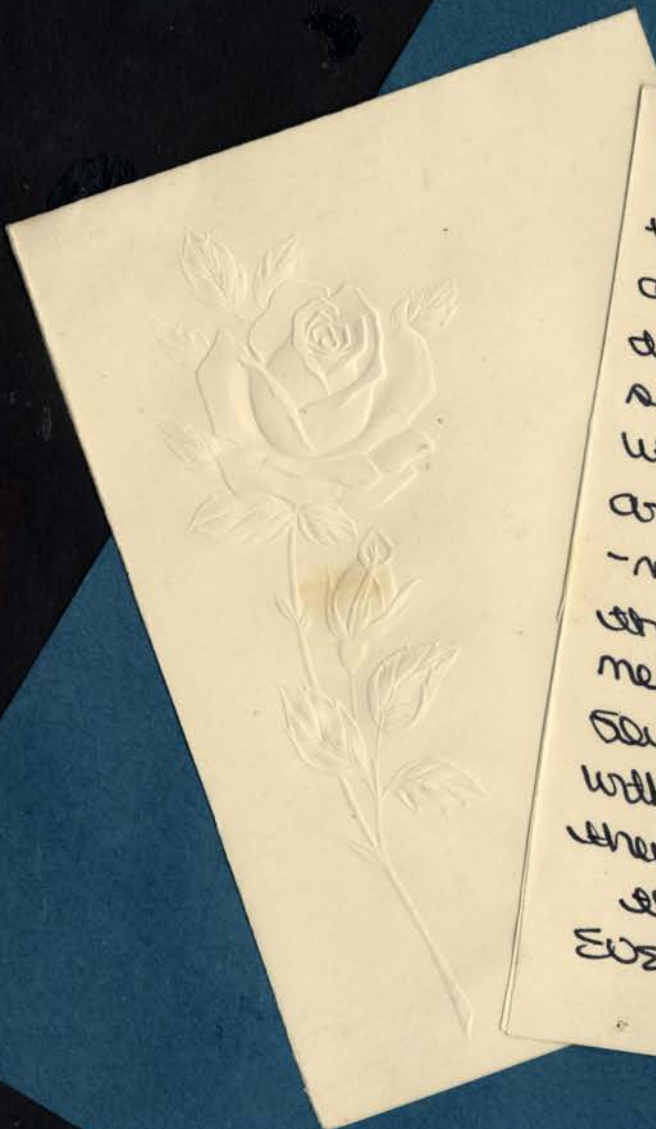

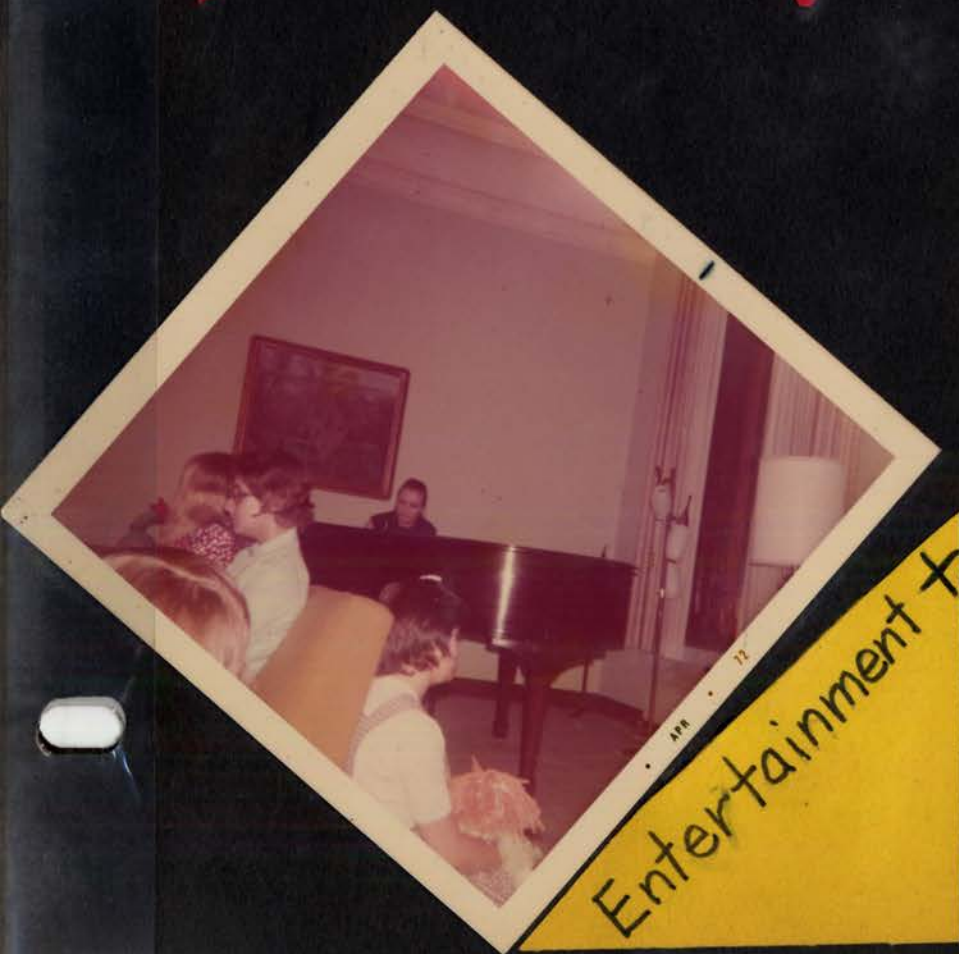
