# THINGS TO DO BEFORE **MOVE-IN DAY**

1. COMPLETE YOUR SHOPPING AND PACKING LIST. We want to make sure you have everything you need for a successful year! If you're renting a Microfridge from Campus Fridges, they will be delivered straight to your room prior to move-in. Students in Pemberton, Ford and McKinney will already have one Microfridge unit in their room at no additional charge. # 2. PURCHASE A PARKING PERMIT

If you are bringing a car and haven't purchased your parking permit, be sure to do so to avoid parking tickets! We do not enforce the student lots until the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of school. Parking permits for students (upperclassman and underclassmen) are available on the Parking Services website here: go.eiu.edu/ParkingPermit. Permits may be purchased online before arriving to and are good for the campus so they will be mailed to your campus or off campus address after August 10. However, they can also be purchased on move-in day, move-in weekend, the first week of classes, or throughout the fall semester.

- 3. CONSIDER RENTER INSURANCE OR PERSONAL **PROPERTY INSURANCE.** Contact your insurance provider to see if you're already covered. Eastern Illinois University and University Housing & Dining Services assume no responsibility for theft or damage to personal property or loss of Store, Java Beanery & money, valuables, or personal effects of any student or quest.
- 4. MAKE SURE YOU KNOW HOW YOUR MEAL PLAN WORKS. Throughout the school year you can use your meal swipes in any of our Dining Centers (South Quad Dining Center and Stevenson Tower). Swipes reset every Monday Additional Dining Dollars may morning and do not roll over. You can use one swipe every two hours. Dining be purchased in \$5 increments Dollars can be used in places like the Food Court, Java B&B, and Thomas Marketplace Convenience Store. Check out our menu here: eiu.edu/dining.

You can increase your plan at any time during the semester. If you want to decrease your Fall 2024 meal plan, you must submit your change request in writing by August 23, 2024. The request must come from the student and include the desired meal plan and the student's name. Email requests to housing@eiu.edu.

# **MEAL SWIPES PER WEEK**

are served in South Quad Dining Center and Stevenson Tower. Unused meals do not accumulate nor are they reimbursed. They're reset on Monday mornings.

**BONUS MEALS,** like meal swipes per week, are meals served in the residential dining centers. They may be used as extra meal swipes semester in which they are provided. Unused meal swipes do not accumulate nor are they reimbursed.

**DINING DOLLARS** can be used for a' la carte purchases at Marketplace Convenience Bakery, and University Food Court. Dining Dollars deplete as they are used and are good for the academic year.

# CHECKING INTO YOUR NEW HOME

RESIDENCE HALLS, GREEK COURT AND UNIVERSITY COURT: When you arrive to campus, please follow the signs outside of all our residence halls. Park your car in the parking lot while you check in. After you receive your keys, you can pull your car up to unload your items and use our blue carts to help you move in. Then re-park your car to minimize traffic congestion. Panther Pals will also be available to help only on Thursday, August 15.

Electronic bills will be sent in early August. Students will receive an electronic copy of their bill in their Panthermail email accounts. This message notifies students that their most recent University billing statement is available online via their PAWS account at eu.edu/paws.

Once the notification has been sent, it is the responsibility of the student to provide any third party (i.e., parent, guardian, etc.) copies of the billing statement. # **BEFORE CLASSES BEGIN, BE SURE TO...**

# **1. LEARN WHAT IS HAPPENING ON CAMPUS.** Follow your Residence Hall, Greek Court, or

University Court on Facebook to stay connected. Select halls have Intagram pages as well.

# 2. CONNECT TO THE UNIVERSITY NETWORK.

Your computer must meet the minimum required specifications available in the ITS Student Tech Guide. Your username and password are available at password.eiu.edu.

**WIRELESS:** Double click on the WiFi icon on your desktop and choose "eiuwifi."

**SMART DEVICES:** All devices including gaming systems, smart TVs, streaming devices, smart assistants and enabled devices will have to be registered at **go.eiu.edu/devices** when already connected to the EIU Network.

**ETHERNET:** For the best gaming experience, connect your device using an Ethernet cable.

You can also download Microsoft Office 365 software (Word, Excel, and PowerPoint) for free. Anti-virus and other software packages are also available from the ITS Help Desk. For help, call the Gregg Technology Center at **217-581-7633**.

- **3. PICK UP YOUR TEXTBOOKS.** Textbooks can be picked up at the Textbook Rental Service Building. During move-in weekend, there will be extended hours.
- **4. HAVE YOUR PANTHER CARD FOR YOUR MEAL PLANS.** If you got your Panther Card at Orientation, your meal plan should have automatically been added. If you got your Panther Card after Orientation, stop by the Housing & Dining Office to active your meal plan. For more information call **217-581-5111**.

# **5. READ THE ON-CAMPUS HANDBOOK.** As part of the EIU residential community, you are responsible for all policies, procedures, and guidelines as outlined in the Housing & Dining On-Campus Handbook located here: **eiu.edu/housing/policies.php**.



# SECURE YOUR HOUSING FOR NEXT YEAR

### 1. ANDREWS HALL

Turn south on Ninth Street. At the second stop sign, turn right on Roosevelt Avenue. Turn right on Seventh Street and left into the Andrews Hall drop off area. Once unloaded, proceed to the South Lot or the Newman Center Lot for parking.

## 2. LAWSON HALL

Turn south on Fourth Street. Proceed through the stop sign and turn left into the Lawson Hall drop off area. Once unloaded, proceed to the West Lot for parking.

### 3. TAYLOR HALL

Turn south on Fourth Street. Proceed through the stop sign and turn into the Taylor Hall drop off area. Once unloaded, proceed to the West Lot for parking.

### 4. LINCOLN, STEVENSON & POWELL-NORTON HALLS

Turn south on University Drive and left on Grant Avenue. Turn right into the J Lot for both parking and unloading or continue to the Stevenson Hall drop off area. Once unloaded, proceed to the J Lot or Stadium Lot for parking. 5. PEMBERTON HALL

Turn south on University Drive and left on Grant Avenue. At the stop sign turn left on Fourth Street and right into the Pemberton drop off area. Once unloaded, proceed to the J Lot or Stadium Lot for parking.

### 6. MCKINNEY & FORD HALLS

Turn south on Fourth Street. After the first stop sign, turn left into the Weller drop off area. Once unloaded, proceed to the E Lot for parking.

# 7. GREEK COURT

Turn south on Ninth Street. At the second stop sign, turn left on Roosevelt Avenue. Parking lots are provided behind each building.

### 8. UNIVERSITY APARTMENTS

Turn south on Fourth Street. After the stop sign turn right on Terrace Lane. Veer right off Terrace Lane into University Apartments Lot.

### 9. UNIVERSITY COURT

Turn south on Ninth Street. After the second stop sign, turn right into the University Court parking lot.
