Our Aging Studies degrees prepare students to empower and advocate on behalf of older adults
with acquired expertise and skill, support families and caregivers, promote community services
and resources for aging, and serve as leaders with expertise and compassion while serving our
aging population with dignity, respect, and care.

Why Consider Aging Studies as a 2nd Master's Degree?

• With the growing older adult population, the need for gerontologists and professionals with expertise in aging/later life is increasing. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, professionals will experience faster-than-average job growth in gerontology/aging fields.

Features of Aging Studies as a 2nd Master's Degree:

- Students may share up to 12 credit hours (4 courses) from the first master's degree and count those toward the M.S. in Aging Studies, potentially meaning as few as 7 courses in only 2-3 more semesters to fulfill requirements. Graduate Coordinators of both degree programs and the students collaboratively determine a finalized study plan and timeline.
- The M.S. in Aging Studies is a fully online degree with no on-campus requirements.
- Students who live within driving distance of campus may apply for Graduate Assistantships, which include full tuition waivers for up to 3 semesters + a monthly stipend of just over \$1000.
