
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

Meet students where they are


- Many students are ambivalent about hazing.

- You can't convince someone to change.




Baby Steps

of college students self-identify as having been hazed.








Gordie's death was entirely preventable.

"Participating in a drinking game" was the most frequently reported hazing behavior among college students.

Tied for third was "drinking large amounts of alcohol to the point of getting sick or passing out."




Bartender School!





1 Standard Drink = 0.6 fluid oz. of 100% alcohol





Alcohol percentage and container volume will determine number of standard drinks.
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What makes alcohol so dangerous when hazing is involved?





Even small amounts of alcohol impair judgment...

increasing the chances students will engage in risky behaviors they would never do when sober.






Those who haze lie about what will happen and hide potential risks.

Alcohol use can heighten anxiety about the unknown aspects of hazing.







Liquid Courage

Current group members may use alcohol to reduce feelings of guilt or shame for engaging in or allowing hazing activities.

Hazing victims don't fully understand hazing risks, and so, cannot consent.

A person cannot consent when intoxicated.



Medical Amnesty Policies (MAP)

% of students who would be more willing to call for help if campus had a MAP



"Medical Amnesty" is a statewide law and/or campus policy which grants limited legal immunity to people when they seek help for themselves or others who need immediate medical attention due to alcohol or other drug overdose.



Medical Amnesty Impact



Implementing a MAP does NOT increase:

- drinking or
- problems from drinking.

Students are MORE likely to contact RAs in the event of an emergency.



Will you intervene, check for the PUBS signs, and be the one to make the call for help when you see even one sign? If so, take the Pledge to Check.

Be a voice for someone who may not have one.







Meet Students Where They Are

Prior to students arriving:

- PUBS mirror clings placed on 1st year and chapter bathroom mirrors
- PUBS magnets on residence hall & chapter refrigerators
- BAC cards given to all 1st years

Impact of a comprehensive PUBS campaign:



August survey: only **44%** of incoming freshman know PUBS signs of overdose.

October Survey: Increased to **85%** after 8 weeks of exposure to an integrated campaign.

PUBS education impact

The transport report read, "[friend] read the PUBS sticker on the bathroom mirror, identified the symptoms and called for Police and EMS."

"Thank you for PUBS! The EMTs told me I probably saved his life."

"You'd be proud to know that because I knew PUBS, I got medical attention for an underclassman who had had too much to drink."




