#### PLOT SYNOPSIS:

The story of Saint-Georges' Sword & Bow is centered on a rivalry as old as time: classical vs. contemporary. Thirteen-year-old Giselle is dead set on becoming a famous pop star; her father insists that studying music theory is much more important. The supernatural arrival of Jospeh Bologne, Le Chevalier de Saint-Georges, whisks Giselle back in time to learn about Bologne's personal life and professional passions. As she gets to know Joseph, his complicated story, and his incredible compositions, Giselle realizes that there might be more to classical music than meets the modern ear.

# Dr. Ji Myung Kim, Violin

A native of South Korea, violinist Ji Myung Kim came to the US when he was fourteen years old to study violin under C.J. Chang and Robert de Pasquale in Philadelphia. Ever since then Kim's artistry has dazzled his audiences around the world including the Queen of Denmark, the prime minister of Japan, and two former Presidents of South Korea. Career highlights include the critically acclaimed NYC debut in Lincoln Center performing and premiering his own cadenzas to Mozart's fifth violin concerto with the New York Classical Symphony Orchestra.

Since 2015, Kim has been serving as an adjudicator for the New York International Artists Competition and the East Coast International Competition and became the recipient of 2017 Grace Meng U.S. Congress Award for his excellence in the field of Music and Art in the New York region. With violist Yong Joo Ahn, Kim is the cofounder and leader of Ensemble D'Amici now in its fifth season with concert engagements in the US and in Korea. As an avid chamber musician, Kim has collaborated with violinist Pamela Frank, cellist Peter Wiley, pianist Hae Sun Paik, and the members of Tokyo, Orion, and Verona Quartets. # Yong Joo Ahn, Viola

Renowned for his charismatic stage presence, powerful interpretations and compelling musical integrity, violist and conductor Yong Joo Ahn continues to attract attention widely as one of the most outstanding conductors, soloists and chamber musicians of our time.

After studying with Jodi Levitz at San Francisco Conservatory, Atar Arad at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, and Hsin-Yun Huang at New England Conservatory Ahn went on to winning the Grand Prize from the Korea National Music Association Competition and Seoul Chamber Music Competition, as well as many awards from other major concerto competitions. He has also served as artist-in-residence with the Culture & Art Center Chamber Music Society

in South Korea and Zephyr International Chamber Music Festival in Italy. He has made guest appearances as the principal viola of major orchestras in Korea including Seoul and Daejeon Philharmonic.

As a much sought-after clinician, he has been invited to give masterclasses at Murray State University in the US and Sapporo Otani University in Japan. Ahn has also served as the music director and conductor at Opera Bach-Millennium Music and Tri-Valley Youth Orchestra and Choir in San Francisco. Currently, he is the professor of viola and the music director at Ulsan University in Korea.



# Karina Herrera Zambrano, Horn

Karina Itzel Herrera Zambrano is a second year Music Education student, at EIU studying with Dr. Jessica Pearce and Molly Frederick. Beginning trumpet in 2014, they quickly progressed to horn early on in 2017. Karina graduated from Belleville West High School in 2023. In high school, they played in the marching band, concert band, and jazz band. They have participated in several ensembles outside of high school, including ILMEA District 6 Band, Mckendree Honor Band, the Belleville Youth Orchestra, the St. Louis Symphony Youth Orchestra as an alternate, and the St. Louis Academy Brass Band. After graduating EIU, they plan on pursuing

a masters and doctorate in performance to eventually teach at the collegiate level.



# **David Commanday, Director**

Director of Orchestral Activities and Instructor of Applied Cello at Eastern Illinois University, Professor Commanday is also Artistic Director and Conductor of the Heartland Festival Orchestra, and an active guest conductor. He brings great depth of experience to his post at EIU, since his career combines international accomplishment as professional conductor, national prominence as a leader in the youth orchestra field, and distinction in the Academy of higher education. Among many awards received, the Illinois Council of Orchestras recognized Commanday as Illinois Professional Conductor of the Year.

Professor Commanday has a distinguished record of accomplishment with young musicians. As Music Director of the Boston Youth Symphony Orchestras, he received two ASCAP Awards for innovative programming of American music and for works he commissioned and premiered.

Professor Commanday is a cum laude graduate of Harvard College, and was awarded highest honors in his State Diploma of Orchestral Conducting at the University of Vienna. He has taught and conducted at Harvard, MIT, Boston University, Montclair University, Eureka College, and Bradley University, and was tenured Associate Professor on the faculty of Virginia Commonwealth University.

As a cellist, Commanday often plays in chamber music performances with visiting artists - including among others Yo-Yo Ma, Bobby McFerrin, Matt Haimovitz, Adam Neiman, Rachel Barton Pine, Jason Vieaux, and Michael Stephen Brown. At Eastern Illinois University he is the cellist of the Eastern Piano Trio with colleagues Shichao Zhang and Ji Myung Kim.



# DOUDNA FINE ARTS CENTER PATRON SERVICES GUIDELINES

#### **Usher Staff**

Ushers are located at the entrance of the venue. If you have a question or a problem, please let them know and they will contact the House Manager.

#### **Ticket Policies**

Please note that all ticket sales are final, and refunds will not be given.

#### **Late Arrival**

During classical concerts, late seating will only take place during the first convenient pause in the program.

During jazz, folk, world, or pop concerts, late seating is more casual, but ushers may ask you to wait to be seated between pieces. Please check with an usher regarding when you may enter the venue.

#### Mobile Devices, Photography and Recording

Please turn off all light-illuminating or sound-emitting devices. Mobile phone use is strictly prohibited inside all venues. Text-messaging and the taking of photographs or videos by phone are not permitted.

The use of cameras - with or without flash - and recording devices is a violation of copyright law and discourteous to other audience members.

Failure to comply will result in being asked to leave the performance without a refund.

#### **Doctor and Parent Emergency Calls**

If you are a medical professional/parent with a sitter at home, please put you phone on silent and wait to take the call until you are out of the performance venue.

#### No Smoking

Eastern Illinois University is a tobacco-free campus. Smoking of any kind, including electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on all university property.

#### **Food and Beverages**

Food is not allowed inside any of the venues. Only beverages in the special Doudna drink cup, with a secured lid, are permitted in the venues.

#### Accessibility

Special seating areas for wheelchair accessibility are available. Contact the Box Office in advance to secure a seat in these areas. Audio amplification is available for the hearing-impaired free of charge. A driver's license or other identification is all that is required for deposit.

#### In the Event of an Emergency

Emergency exits may be found outside of the venue and are marked accordingly. The lighted "Exit" sign nearest your seat is the shortest route out of the building.
