TONIGHT'S GUEST ARTISTS

Thomas Birkner serves on the faculty of Southwestern Illinois College where he leads the Jazz Band and teaches Jazz Improvisation, Applied Trumpet, and American Popular Music. Birkner holds degrees from Eastern Illinois University and the University of Illinois. He has been recognized as an outstanding soloist by the International Trumpet Guild and has performed with a range of musicians including Louie Bellson, Clark Terry, Joe Williams, and Nancy Wilson; with international performances in Sweden, Italy, and Denmark. Formerly Director of Instrumental Music at Belleville West High School, performances under his direction include Ontario, Canada, Germany, and the White House in Washington, D.C. Prior teaching assignments include the University of Illinois, Parkland College, and South High School in Terre Haute, Indiana. Active as a clinician and conductor, he has served on the faculty of the Summer Jazz Camp at Eastern Illinois University for over thirty-five years.

Aaron Eckert, originally from Belleville, IL, is a trombonist with the U.S. Army Blues, the premier jazz ensemble of the Army. He has performed with artists such as Jon Faddis, Jeff Hamilton, Chuck Israels, Conrad Herwig, and Scott Wendholt. With the Army Blues, Aaron has performed across the capital region, including the White House, Capitol Building, and Kennedy Center. In addition to the Blues, Aaron performs regularly in the D.C. area in a wide variety of musical settings. Before moving to D.C., Eckert served as the Low Brass Instructor at Mt. Hood Community College in Gresham, OR. He now serves on the faculty at George Mason University. Aaron completed his master's degree with a Performer's Certificate at the Eastman School of Music, with degrees in Jazz and Contemporary Media Performance (trombone) and Performance and Literature (euphonium). While at Eastman, Eckert was awarded 1st prize in the Rich Matteson Jazz Euphonium Competition and 2nd prize (as a member of the Carillon Tuba Quartet) in the ensemble competition at the International Tuba Euphonium Conference. Eckert holds bachelor's degrees in Music Education and Jazz Studies from Eastern Illinois University.

THE EIU JAZZ ENSEMBLE

The EIU Jazz Ensemble is directed by Sam Fagaly. The group has received numerous awards including Outstanding Ensemble and Solo Performance citations at the Notre Dame and Elmhurst College jazz festivals as well as from Downbeat magazine. They have been featured at the International Association for Jazz Education and Illinois Music Educators Association conferences and have performed with legendary jazz artists Mel Torme, Dizzy Gillespie, Diane Schuur, and Joe Williams among others. The Jazz Ensemble's latest album is entitled *Body and Soul*.
