

ABOUT THE OPERA

The Old Maid and the Thief is a radio opera in one act by Italian-American composer Gian Carlo Menotti. Commissioned by NBC, The Old Maid and the Thief was one of the earliest operas composed specifically for performance on the radio. The opera unravels the hidden secrets and gossip of a seemingly tranquil town. Miss Todd, a middle-aged spinster who spends her days knitting and exchanging whispers with her companion Miss Pinkerton, finds her life upended when a beggar appears at her door during a rainy afternoon. Both she and her maid, Laetitia, are immediately drawn to the charming stranger and eagerly offer him shelter. Even after suspecting that he may be an escaped convict, they resort to theft and deceit to keep him around. Miss Todd, having abandoned all moral standards, is heartbroken to learn that not only does Bob not return her affections, but he is not the thief she assumed. In a twist of fate, Bob and Laetitia steal Miss Todd's fortune and run off together when she threatens to frame him for her own crimes. Menotti writes in the libretto "The devil couldn't do what a woman can-Make a thief out of an honest man."

COMPOSER GIAN CARLO MENOTTI

Gian-Carlo Menotti (Composer, Writer) (1911–2007) was an Italian-American composer and librettist, renowned for his contributions to 20th-century opera. Trained in Berlin and Milan, Menotti's first opera, *The Protagonist* (1926), marked the beginning of his successful career. His collaborations with playwright Bertolt Brecht brought him prominence in Europe, though he fled the rise of Nazi Germany in 1933, eventually settling in the United States. Throughout his career, Menotti championed social justice themes and worked with prominent lyricists and playwrights, adapting his style to suit diverse audiences.

Menotti's notable works include *The Consul* (1950), *The Medium* (1946), *Amahl and the Night Visitors* (1951), and *The Old Maid and the Thief* (1939), among others. His operas often blend poignant drama with accessibility, making his music widely admired. He passed away in 2007, leaving behind a significant legacy in both opera and musical theater.

BIOGRAPHIES



Director - Dr. Julie Junghwa Park is an active concert artist and opera singer who has performed with the New York Lyric Opera in New York City, Castleton Music Festival under the direction of Maestro Lorin Maazel, the National Music Opera Theater ensemble in Kassel, Germany and Salon Opera festival in Seoul, South-Korea. Ms. Park's concert works include Gala concerts at San leo, Rimini, Cervia, Cesena, Montegridolfo, Novafeltria in Italy, Kassel in Germany, Dusznik in Poland.

Dietlinde Turban Maazel, the Castleton Music Festival Founder and Artistic Director describes Ms.Park as "Not only does she have natural predilection for the art of interpreting classical music, but she is also exceptionally skillful in expressing her interpretations and conceptualizations for a given piece of music in actual voice performances – she has the utmost creativity and technical skills that are so highly developed and precise."

Dr. Park has received her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Voice from Rutgers University, a Master of Music degree and Professional Studies certificate from the Manhattan School of Music, a Bachelor of Music degree from the Ewha Womans University in Seoul, Korea and Diplomas from the Staatliche Musik Akademie in Kassel, Germany, and Orfeo Music Academy in Parma, Italy.

Dr. Park made her solo recital debut at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in 2012, where she also performed in the Winners' Concerts of the Golden Era of Romantic Music International Competition and BAIVC International Competition as a first-prize winner. Since then, she has performed numerous solo recitals and concerts at prestigious music venues, including Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Symphony Space, The DiMenna Center, Steinway Hall, and Yamaha Hall.



Pianist - Zinuo Zeng is a first-year graduate student at EIU and earned a bachelor's degree from Zhejiang Conservatory of Music in China.

Usher Staff

Ushers are located at the entrance of the venue. If you have a question or a problem, please let them know and they will contact the House Manager.

Ticket Policies

Please note that all ticket sales are final, and refunds will not be given.

Late Arrival

During classical concerts, late seating will only take place during the first convenient pause in the program.

During jazz, folk, world, or pop concerts, late seating is more casual, but ushers may ask you to wait to be seated between pieces. Please check with an usher regarding when you may enter the venue.

Mobile Devices, Photography and Recording

Please turn off all light-illuminating or sound-emitting devices. Mobile phone use is strictly prohibited inside all venues. Text-messaging and the taking of photographs or videos by phone are not permitted.

The use of cameras - with or without flash - and recording devices is a violation of copyright law and discourteous to other audience members.

Failure to comply will result in being asked to leave the performance without a refund.

Doctor and Parent Emergency Calls

If you are a medical professional/parent with a sitter at home, please put you phone on silent and wait to take the call until you are out of the performance venue.

No Smoking

Eastern Illinois University is a tobacco-free campus. Smoking of any kind, including electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on all university property.

Food and Beverages

Food is not allowed inside any of the venues. Only beverages in the special Doudna drink cup, with a secured lid, are permitted in the venues.

Accessibility

Special seating areas for wheelchair accessibility are available. Contact the Box Office in advance to secure a seat in these areas. Audio amplification is available for the hearing-impaired free of charge. A driver's license or other identification is all that is required for deposit.

In the Event of an Emergency

Emergency exits may be found outside of the venue and are marked accordingly. The lighted "Exit" sign nearest your seat is the shortest route out of the building.
