**Leadership Roles**

**Eastern Illinois University, 2017-present.** EIU is a Master's-L Carnegie institution enrolling over 8,800 students (5966 FTEs) in FA22 with a comprehensive program array. Over the past decade, EIU has consistently been ranked by USNWR as a top tier institution for regional public schools in a 12-state region.

**Provost & Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs (8/22-present); Provost & Vice President for Academic Affairs (6/17-7/22).** As the chief academic officer, I am responsible for providing leadership for the division and oversight of four academic colleges (Liberal Arts & Sciences, Health & Human Services, Business & Technology, and Education), the Pine Honors College, the Graduate School, Enrollment Management, Admissions, Marketing/Communications, Financial Aid, Registrar, the Academic Success Center, Inclusion & Academic Engagement, Faculty Development & Innovation, the Booth Library, the Cultural Center, and WEIU (television & radio). With a divisional budget exceeding \$55m in appropriated monies and \$6-7m in additional annual revenues, grants, and gifts, the Division of Academic Affairs is comprised of approximately 385 FT faculty, 90 PT instructors, and 200 staff that are responsible for all academic programs and related student services. Major divisional accomplishments:

- enhancing enrollment with increases in FTE (FA18, SP19, FA19, SP20, FA20, SP21, FA21, FA22), total headcount (SP18, FA18, SP19, FA19, SP20, FA20, SP21, FA22), and graduate students (FA18, SP19, FA19, SP20, FA20, FA21, SP22, FA22), as well as consistent growth in fall first-time fulltime (FA18, FA19, FA20, FA22)
- consistent international student increases since Fall 2017(n=378) with record Fall 2022 enrollments (n=767)
- expansion of intramural grant opportunities as well as positive annual growth in extramural grant monies (FY19, FY20, FY21, FY22), as well as an increase in average award amounts, since Fall 2017
- launching new internal funding programs (Student Impact Grants, 2017-present & API Grants, 2022-present)
- securing a 2019 \$2.65m gift to create an undergraduate degree in nursing and the Gail & Richard Lumpkin School of Nursing (2019); \$1.5m donation in 2021 from Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center; \$1.3m in GEER funding to support access, equity, and student success through 2022; and \$969,073 for EIU's Illinois Innovation Network Hub with Lake Land College
- a \$118m state appropriation for a science building (2019), led the review of 18 architectural proposals (2020), represented EIU at the CDB's architect selection process (2020) with design ongoing (2021-present)
- creating the Center for Student Innovation to promote active learning including obtaining major philanthropic gifts and grants
- launching the Latinx & Spanish Language Academic Hub (2022), as well as the ongoing planning and investments necessary to create hubs to support our African American/African Diaspora and Asian American & Pacific Islander communities
- a campus-wide 2017 taskforce on student success that resulted in program pilots in AY1819 (Learning Communities & Supplemental Instruction), an enhanced mobile friendly early alert system, consolidation of academic services in a single location, and a new virtual one-stop resource. In Fall 2020, programming expanded to include a residential mentoring initiative.
- collaboratively designing and implementing a comprehensive realignment of the division that created a new College of Health & Human Services
- partnering with a suburban Chicago school district (D214) to launch EIU's first traditional dual credit program that now serves roughly 2,300 learners, as well as expanded an online dual enrollment framework serving rural downstate high school students
- working with faculty and deans to initiate new undergraduate and graduate programs including nursing, electrical engineering, health administration, exercise science, sport studies, television & media production, digital media, construction, engineering technology, hospitality & tourism, fashion merchandising & design, MAT in secondary teaching, and health sciences

- creating 15 new accelerated master's degree program options, 2018-present
- negotiating a four-year bargaining agreement with UPI partners representing faculty and academic professionals (2018), as well as multiple COVID era agreements (2-2020, 2-2021, 2-2022)
- working with the leadership team to advocate for EIU in policy venues and the General Assembly including budget and targeted subject-area testimony
- responding to Illinois' k-12 teacher shortage vis-à-vis an externally funded Rural Teacher's initiative (2018), a post-baccalaureate Golden Apple Accelerator scholarship program (2020), expanded Grow Your Own partnerships & scholarships (2018 & 2021), an IBHE Early Childhood Education consortium (2021-present); and \$750,000 in Congressionally-directed spending for a MAT degree

**Bellarmine University, 2014-2017.** Bellarmine is a Master's-L Carnegie institution with a balanced collection of liberal arts and professional programs, as well as five doctoral programs. With more than 3,970 students in fall 2016, BU has consistently been recognized as one of the best universities in the south (USNWR #12-2017). The expansion of doctoral programs resulted in a Carnegie re-classification to "doctoral/professional".

**Vice Provost (11/14-6/17)** advanced a diverse multiple office portfolio: Sponsored Projects; Study Abroad; Veteran's Affairs; SEVIS/Homeland Security; Institutional Research & Effectiveness; development initiatives; IRB; Biosafety; and SACS-COC compliance. In 2016, my team created and launched a new administrative unit and curricular framework to house and staff the 50-60 "freshman focus" sections; facilitated the successful transition of the Student Success Center from Enrollment Management to Academic Affairs; and collaboratively developed a new integrated data center in IT to enhance reporting and maximize the new ERP system. During my tenure, the team:

- coordinated the development of four new graduate programs (Ed.D., Ph.D., M.H.S.-CLS, and M.H.S.-RT) as well as one undergraduate degree (Sport Administration) that resulted in record graduate enrollments (2014, 2015, & 2016)
- partnered with advancement on major proposals leading to more than \$2m including support from Henry Luce, Humana, and CIC
- obtained state authorization for distance education in 35 states and coordinated the launch of two online programs prior to KY SARA membership
- worked with faculty to more than triple non-degree graduate headcounts by FA16 vis-à-vis community partnerships and nearly doubled off-site degree delivery (JCPS Literacy Academies and STEAM programs)
- exceeded prior annual grants compared to AY1213, as well as the prior all-time record (AY1112) and three year mean (AY1011-AY1213) with a sustained growth trajectory in all years
- led a successful initiative to increase study abroad participation by 50% that achieved the goal three years ahead of schedule (2016)
- created a VA position to ensure compliance as well as expand co-curricular programming and established PAVE mentoring
- increased VA eligible students (+18% since 2014) and improved USNWR rankings for Veterans each subsequent year (#11-2016 and #8-2017)
- increased enrolled degree seeking international students each year (undergraduate & graduate)
- facilitated the 2016-2017 St. Catharine's teach out, including streamlining transfer practices and SACS-COC approval of new transferred programs in radiation therapy and athletic training
- begun the process of finalizing BU's first transfer agreements (course-by-course & select programs) with Ivy Tech & KCTC, expanding transfer student resources, and streamlining internal procedures for 2017-2018
- redesigned the delivery of M.S. in analytics in 2014-2015 and more than doubled prior cohort enrollment
- initiated a Women in Science speaker series, obtained a Clare Boothe Luce grant to fund undergraduate research, expanded programming around student research and creativity to include graduate students, and developed campus celebration events for students in the arts and humanities
- enhanced the culture of student research including a partnership with student government to fund the first student research grant competition
- participated in the multi-year discernment and phased implementation processes that culminated in a campus wide ERP transition from Jenzibar to Ellucian Colleague

**Acting Vice President for Academic Affairs (12/14-3/15)** worked with the President, Provost, and Cabinet to reorganize the division with responsibilities for faculty affairs (including faculty appointments), program development, and other duties as assigned.

Following reorganization, the division's structure redefined the CAO as Provost, created an executive vice president to work with the President on strategic initiatives, and eliminated the VPAA to reduce costs.

**Assistant Vice-President for Institutional Effectiveness, Research, & Graduate Initiatives (1/14-11/14)** led Sponsored Projects, International Programs, and Institutional Research & Effectiveness. The AVP functioned as the chief research officer inclusive of compliance including IRB, Biosafety, and off campus partnerships. In the area of graduate education, the position worked with faculty governance to enhance program quality, implement entrepreneurial delivery strategies, and create new degrees.

**Indiana State University, 2000-2014.** ISU is a Carnegie designated doctoral/research institution with over 12,100 students (Fall 2013) and an emphasis on community engagement as recognized by the Carnegie Foundation, President's Honor Roll, and Washington Monthly. In Fall 2013, graduate enrollments exceeded 2,175.

**College of Graduate & Professional Studies, Dean of Research & Graduate Education (5/13-1/14).** As the chief academic officer of the college and chief research officer for the university, the dean had oversight of the Center for Global Engagement, Office of Sponsored Programs, and the Center for Student Research & Creativity, as well as primary authority for broader institutional compliance (i.e., IRB, IACUC, & Biosafety). As dean and CRO (2008-2014), the portfolio:

- managed more than \$8m in direct annual expenditures and \$9m in research performance
- developed three new doctoral programs (D.P.T., D.N.P., & D.H.Sc.) and three master's degrees (P.A., M.S.W., & O.T.)
- created a \$100,000 internal COMPETE program to increase research competitiveness
- observed record fall enrollments (FTEs +15%), recruited increased numbers of full-time students (+26%), and halved fall to spring melt between 2008 and 2013
- roughly doubled the number of international students between 2008 and 2013 (FA13, n=926)
- obtained Unbounded Possibilities support to create the Center for Global Engagement—a one stop internationalization effort (recruitment, study abroad, credentialing, programming, and additional staff)
- expanded modes of delivery including an off-site MBA, low residency Ph.D., and converting campus programs to distance/online programs
- established the Center for Student Research & Creativity and enhanced the culture of student scholarship
- implemented strategic enrollment and integrated marketing plans
- proposed a faculty approved dual degree policy and launched the first dual degree (M.P.A.-M.S. in criminology)

**College of Graduate & Professional Studies, Dean (7/08-5/13)** managed college resources, coordinated graduate recruitment and admissions, allocated graduate assistantships, awarded scholarships, created new programs, expanded student services, reviewed graduate faculty, and supervised everyday operations. In 2011, the CGPS role expanded to include International Programs & Services and the Center for Student Research & Creativity.

**Office of International Programs and Services, Interim Director (1/11-5/11)** supervised an academic service unit responsible for international student credentialing, strategic partnerships, study abroad, visiting scholars program, faculty travel grants, student/scholar immigration services, and inter-institutional partnerships.

**College of Arts & Sciences, Associate Dean for Budget & Research (2007-2008; Acting 2006-2007; Administrative Fellow 2005-2006)** managed budget resources, research efforts, graduate studies, annual PT/FT evaluations, and the Corrections Education Program. The AD also coordinated faculty searches and various personnel functions. The college housed more than 20 units, 240+ full time faculty and 150+ adjunct instructors.

**Interim Chairperson (Department of Sociology, 2006-2007; Department of African & African American Studies, SP07) and Director (Social Science Education, 2002-2006)** supervised day-to-day activities including: budget, personnel, curriculum, PT/FT instructor evaluations, scheduling, and new faculty searches.

**American Council on Education (ACE) Fellowship Program, 2012-2013. ACE Fellow** placed at Bellarmine University. As a Fellow, I participated in the yearlong ACE program and completed a project entitled "Strategic Curricular Entrepreneurship: Private Lessons for Public Institutions." The project focused on revenue, affordability, and strategic enrollment management initiatives.
