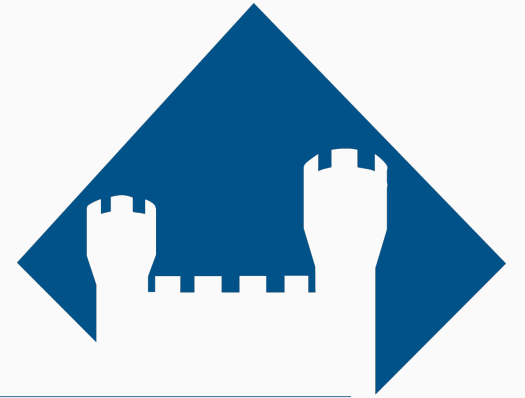

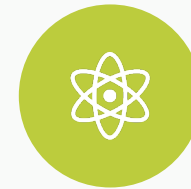

The Department Honors Program in Health Promotion offers an advanced specialization within the Department of Health Promotion. The program includes courses with honors level expectations, research, independent study and thesis options which allow students to customize their experience by following areas of personal interest through more intense and comprehensive exploration.

PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:
There are two ways to be admitted to the Health Promotion Honors Program:

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PROGRAM PLAN OF STUDY:
Honors students meet with the Department Honors Coordinator and their undergraduate academic advisor every semester to select courses and refine their plan of study.

HEALTH PROMOTION AND LEADERSHIP ACCELERATED GRADUATE PROGRAM

THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PROMOTION
AT EASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY

The accelerated graduate program in Health Promotion and Leadership will allow interested students to shorten the length of the BS/MS process by about one semester, providing significant cost savings to students. Undergraduates will have the opportunity to take challenging graduate level courses, providing a unique learning environment and the opportunities for more students earning a graduate level degree.

Program Admission Requirements:
Admission to the accelerated graduate program in Health Promotion and Leadership requires:

- A minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of 3.25
- Completion of a minimum of 60 hours of undergraduate course credit
- Applicants must have completed a minimum of 15 hours of Health Promotion courses, including at least 6 credits at the 3000-level
- Submission of two academic letters of reference
- A written statement of professional goals


All enrolled students must meet with the Health Promotion and Leadership graduate coordinator in addition to their undergraduate academic advisor to select classes. Shared Credit Course Options: Students may select up to three courses from list below. No more than one course may be at the 5000-level.

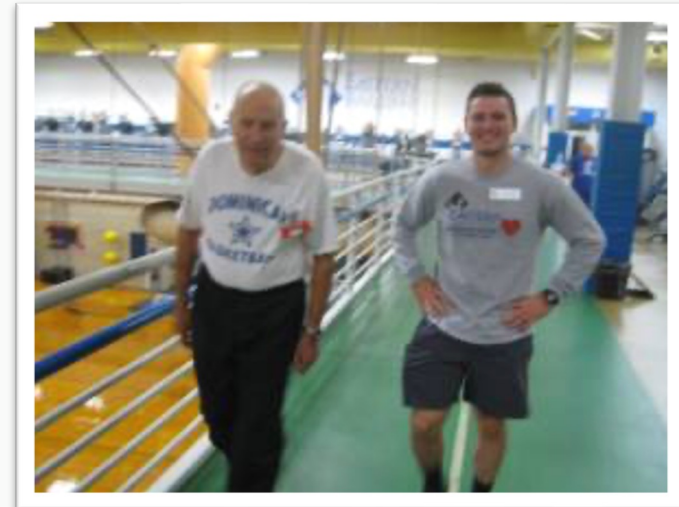
