

PANTHER PROMISE TUITION WAIVER

Transfer Automatic Academic Excellence Scholarship

Academically talented students entering Eastern Illinois University will automatically be offered a Transfer Academic Excellence Scholarship up to \$5,000 (\$2,500 annually) at the time of application to the University. This scholarship is automatically renewable for a total of 2 years (4 semesters).

Textbook Rental Grant

If you are an Illinois resident and you have a minimum of a 3.3/4.0 GPA, you will receive an additional \$300 per year over 2 years.

Panther Promise Tuition Waiver

Students who file a FAFSA and have a household income between \$55,000 and \$100,000 can be awarded up to \$2,500 a year for up to 2 years.

EIU Promise

EIU Promise can significantly reduce – and in some cases completely eliminate – tuition and fees for qualified Illinois students. It is a last-dollar scholarship, meaning that it covers any tuition or fees remaining after other scholarships and awards have been applied.

Honors Scholarship

The Sandra & Jack Pine Honors College offers the Honors Transfer Student Scholarship, a competitive award for new EIU students who have been enrolled in an Honors program at a post-secondary institution before attending Eastern.

Phi Theta Kappa

A one-time award worth \$1,000 for fall admits only. Associate degree required. Application available at <u>Academic Works</u>.

Result for Fall 23 Cohort: 88% of Transfer participants retained Fall to Fall



FALL ENROLLMENT UPDATES



- Total Enrollment at 8505
- 451 new transfers enrolled
- 662 international students from 56 different countries on our campus
- Transfer Retention up by +2.3% at 79%
- 5% increase in room and board contracts with a significant boost in Transfer living on campus

EIU NEW TRANSFER TAKEAWAYS



The top three words Transfer students describe EIU as were Affordable, Friendly, and Supportive.

The campus resources that were most important to Transfer students were support resources, internships/experiential opportunities and campus counseling services.

Transfer students were more locked in than in previous years with only 37% changing their College Choice through the process.

When their College Choice did change it was because of a campus visit, major change or their Financial Aid offer.

57% of Transfer students indicated their parents were involved in their College Choice.












Policy Update

• HB 5057

- Permits candidates to be enrolled in student teaching and graduate with their degree without passing the licensure exam

Supporting Candidates with a Positive Curricular Transition: General Education Advisement Recommendations

- All teacher education candidates are encouraged to come in with equivalents to
 - ENG 1001G, ENG 1002G, and CMN 1310G
 - College Level Math course (Candidates seeking ELE or SPE licensure are encouraged to take MATH 1420 at minimum. If offered, candidates should also take MATH 2420G)
 - If the candidate did not have two years of foreign language with a "C" or better, the candidates are encouraged to take two semesters of foreign language at the community college.



Supporting Candidates with a Positive Curricular Transition: General Education Advisement Recommendations

Additional General Education Recommendations

- Social Science
 - Two different social science areas must be reflected (EDF 2555G is encouraged as it will double count as a general education and professional education course)
 - Equivalent to PLS 1153G is recommended
- Science
 - Biological Science and Physical Science must be represented
 - One course must have a lab
- Arts and Humanities
 - Fine Arts and Humanities must be represented
 - Third World course for SPE majors



Supporting Candidates with a Positive Curricular Transition: Professional Education Advisement Recommendations

- When considering having candidates take professional education courses, consider the candidates' academic performance.
 - Candidates who struggle with general education coursework or a certain general education subject should be advised to take the courses at the community college.
 - Candidates who are successful in general education should be higher priority for being advised to take professional education courses.



Supporting Candidates with a Positive Curricular Transition: Professional Education Advisement Recommendations
