**Executive Session**

Ms. Baurer moved that the Board of Trustees convene in Executive Session to consider employment of employees, collective negotiating matters and executive session minutes as permitted by Section 2.C.1, 2 and 21 of the Open Meetings Act. Dr. Ranchoero seconded the motion. By unanimous vote, motion carried.

Ms. Madigan moved to return to Open Session. Dr. Ranchero seconded the motion. By unanimous vote, motion carried.

The Board of Trustees reconvened after lunch at 1:00 pm in the Dvorak Concert Hall of Doudna Fine Arts Center for the remainder of the Board of Trustees meeting.

### **Report from Board Chair**

Chair Hicks welcomed everyone to the final Board meeting of 2024. He stated the trustees participated in IBHE trustee training during the month of October and all are compliant with the State of Illinois. Chair Hicks thanked the veteran students, employee's and alumni for their service and dedication to our country.

### **Committee Reports**

#### **Executive/Planning Committee**

Mr. Hicks shared President Gatrell's concern about the nation-wide racist text messages that have been reported by higher-ed students, including two EIU students. These are being investigated and a statement from President Gatrell will be going out by end of day addressing it. Springfield is in ongoing negotiations with the senate bill funding – more will be known in the spring. A 7.5% increase was requested in overall appropriations at the IBHE Big Picture meeting that took place in October.

VP Norman updated the Board on Freshman Orientation stating our largest growth in early commitment is in Honors eligible Freshman. International numbers are larger than the average for the past 5 years. The International Scholar Award developed could have a significant impact on our undergraduate international population for Spring and Fall. A \$2000 award is available for all admitted international undergraduate students and renewable for up to four years. The EIU Branding Guide is ready to launch. Erin Howarth, former cross-country coach has been hired as the Daily Visit Coordinator and will begin on December 6.

#### **Finance/Audit Committee**

Dr. Ranchero reported on the two purchase approvals to be voted on. VP Bierman stated money was set aside at year end last year in anticipation of this request. The Line-Item Status Report prepared by Mike Hutchinson was reviewed. An update on campus projects was given, including the science building project which continues to move forward. As part of the strategic plan, an outside consultant has been brought in to recommend a facilities investment plan. They have determined we are underutilized in many of our spaces and we should receive their final report in December.

#### **University Advancement and Alumni Relations Committee**



Ms. Everett shared VP Spencer’s report. Annual Giving is being revised to personalize and produce more gifts. We will see a shift to storytelling, impact reporting, stewardship and engagement. VP Spencer shared plans regarding professional development plans ahead of EIU’s campaign. FY25 gifts as of November 5, 2024 total \$2,701,295. This includes cash, gifts in kind and pledges from 1547 donors.

**Academic and Student Affairs Committee**

Mr. Hicks reported on the action item Bachelor of Social Work presented by VP Hendrickson and his report on the D.W.F Initiative. He shared VP Flaherty’s update on Student Legal Services and the work they do. “The Mission of Eastern Illinois Student Legal Services is to provide preventative legal education, legal consultation and legal advice and referral to eligible students to enhance student knowledge of rights and responsibilities and positively impact educational outcomes and retention of students.” VP Flaherty also updated the Trustees on the Mental Health Early Action on Campus (MHEAC) Grant FY2025 & Competitive Grant 2025.

#### **President’s Report**

President Gatrell introduced Ms. Shawn Peoples, Director of Civil Rights who gave a presentation on Title IX. Title IX covers every aspect of federally funded education programs: access to higher education, athletics, and education for pregnant and parenting students.

#### **Earned Degrees Report**

VP Hendrickson shared university data on the number of total degrees earned in the past academic year. Majors with the largest number of bachelor’s degree recipients in FY24 were BA in Psychology, BA in Interdisciplinary Studies, BSEd in Elementary Education, BS in Biological Sciences, BS in Organizational Development and BS in Exercise Science.

#### **Reports from Constituencies**

Faculty Senate, Todd Bruns: Mr. Bruns reported that Faculty Senate has met four times since the last Board meeting covering an array of agenda topics including ADA compliance concerns; student support services; student success initiatives; international student support; student mental health;

AI developments and E books available via textbook rental. Mr. Bruns also gave a brief presentation on The Keep Digital Exhibits – a new platform for students to post their posters [The Keep | Digital Exhibits - Eastern Illinois University](#) and Welcome to Scholars @ EIU which features faculty profiles and collaborations within the past 5 years [Eastern Illinois University Scholars @ EIU](#).

Student Government, Ameenah Morris: Ms. Morris updated the Board on the Executive Board Members of Student Government. President, Taylor Cloud; Executive VP, Ameenah Morris; VPAA Ty Rea; VPSA, Mason Tegeler. They have 15 active Senators and Megan Fox was appointed Parliamentarian. Recent events were Dining with the Deans on 10/18 and book Bingo on 10/30; Managing Finals Stress will be on 11/15.

### FY 2024 Deposit & Investment Report for the Quarter ended 9-30-2024

For the quarter ending September 30, 2024, the University had an average daily invested cash balance of \$97,901,362.46 and a net average daily balance of \$95,486,072.32. The annualized average yield was 5.34%.

### FY24 Income Producing Grants and Contracts

FY2024 income producing contracts valued at \$10,000 or more totaled \$2,585,617 compared to \$2,330,649 in FY2023. FY2024 income producing contracts valued at \$10,000 or less totaled \$164,850.

### FY 24 Tuition Waivers

FY2024 undergraduate tuition waivers averaged \$6337.70 for 1688 undergraduate students and graduate tuition waivers averaged \$4700.50 for 635 graduate students.

**B. The Gardella Family Court at McAfee Gym.**

In recognition of the philanthropic support of Mr. Joseph Gardella ('89) and his family for the renovations at McAfee Gym and their multigenerational commitment to Eastern Illinois University, the University recommends that the volleyball venue located in the South Gym will be renamed "The Gardella Family Court". As required by IGP #148, the University Naming Committee has reviewed the request and has voted to support the recommendation.

**It is recommended that the Board of Trustees designate and rename the South Gym at McAfee "The Gardella Family Court".**

### **C. Board of Trustees Affirmation of the University Mission & Vision Statements**

Based on the recommendation of the 2024 Higher Learning Commission's Site Team exit interview, the University reaffirms its commitment to the Eastern Illinois University Mission and Vision statements as presented below:

#### **Mission Statement**

Eastern Illinois University is a public comprehensive university that offers superior, accessible undergraduate and graduate education. Students learn the methods and results of free and rigorous inquiry in the arts, humanities, sciences, and professions, guided by a faculty known for its excellence in teaching, research, creative activity, and service. The University community is committed to diversity and inclusion and fosters opportunities for student-faculty scholarship and applied learning experiences within a student-centered campus culture. Throughout their education, students refine their abilities to reason and to communicate clearly so as to become responsible citizens and leaders.

#### **Vision Statement**

Eastern Illinois University will be a premier comprehensive university, global in its reach and impact, where personal connections with faculty and staff support students' academic success.

**It is recommended that the Board of Trustees reaffirm and approve the institution's mission and vision statements.**

**D. Personnel Contract – President Gatrell**

Multi-year personnel contract for Jay D. Gatrell, Ph.D. beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2029. The annual salary remains unchanged at \$320,000. Should the president return to faculty status or be reassigned, the contract includes an irrevocable elective option of a less than full time benefits-eligible 9-month tenured appointment with prior notice.

**It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the personnel contract.**

### **E. Board of Trustees Regulation Revision, First Reading**

The following revision is a nomenclature revision as a result of the revised by-laws and name the former Council on University Planning and Budget. The committee will be known as the “Leadership Council on Mission, Planning, and Budget”. No substantive changes in the Board Regulations are requested.

EIU Board Regulations, Article II.E.2.

Leadership Council on Mission, Planning and Budget (“LCMPB”).

The University shall establish a university-wide budget committee composed of faculty, staff, and students selected so as to provide representation of academic and support areas consistent with a practical committee size. LCMPB shall participate in making recommendations to the President and the Board with respect to:

- a. The setting of program priorities in the University budget.
- b. Periodic review of the University budget.
- c. Transfers of significant amounts among internal budget items.

To operate effectively, LCMPB members should familiarize themselves with previous budgets and with existing budget formulas; familiarize themselves with the data reporting procedures used in the University; and develop a good working knowledge of the financial operation of the University. To aid LCMPB in its functions, the appropriate administrative officers shall keep LCMPB members and all fiscal agents informed concerning budget formulas, budgetary procedures, and calendars as they are formulated at the University and higher levels. It is expected that broad committee representation will provide maximum opportunity for a voice for the faculty, staff, and students as a whole.

### Financial Aid Programs Report

More than 50% of Eastern's total student population and more than 78% of the eligible students received some type of financial assistance in FY 2024 in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, tuition waivers and/or employment from various federal, state, university, and other programs. Financial aid in FY 2024 totaled \$89,494,463, an increase of \$1,670,378 or 1.90% over FY 2023. The percentage breakdown of financial aid sources was: 40% federal, 18% state, 32% institutional, and 10% other.
